## GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

- Students should always carry the Almanac to School.
- No child should leave his/ her class room without the class pass / activity pass.
- Lending/borrowing money & carrying mobile phones/i-pads/any other electronic gadgets to school is not permitted.
- Permitted vehicles must be kept locked. Riding cycles or motor bikes in the school premises is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Students should attend school in proper uniform.
- Students should not be allowed to leave the school during working hours, unless the authorised person, whose signatures are on the first page of diary, comes in person to make the request.
- 7. Students should carry school identity cards to school everyday.


