4. In case of a student being on medical leave, medical certificate by certified Medical authority and duly sanctioned by the Principal should be submitted. In such case the average marks in that particular subject would be awarded on the basis of remaining exams that the child had appeared.

# **GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS**

- 1. Students should always carry the Almanac to School.
- 2. No child should leave his/ her class room without the class pass / activity pass.
- 3. Lending/borrowing money & carrying mobile phones/i-pads/any other electronic gadgets to school is not permitted.
- 4. Permitted vehicles must be kept locked. Riding cycles or motor bikes in the school premises is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Students should attend school in proper uniform.
- Students should not be allowed to leave the school during working hours, unless the authorised person, whose signatures are on the first page of diary, comes in person to make the request.
- 7. Students should carry school identity cards to school everyday.
- 8. Students should not include in any disruptive activity. A severe action will be taken against the students who are found guilty of such behaviour & their names are liable to be removed from the school rolls.

- 10. Students upto class VIII can come in decent/graceful casual dress on their birthday. Senior class students (IX to XII) are not allowed for the same. Cake bringing/cutting is not permitted in school for any class students.
- 11. Students who want to apply for T.C., should give application for the same before 31 March, otherwise one month fee will be charged or till the month the student is name continued in that class. To get the SLC, student has to produce 'No Dues Slip 'along with a fee of Rs . 200/-as SLC fees.


